How it works

Trilogy is a learning partner in the Johnson & Johnson - Dartmouth Community Mental Health Program, also called the Individual Placement and Support (IPS) supported employment learning collaborative. The IPS model for supported employment is the most progressive, evidence-based model to be offered to individuals with mental illness

- It creates a more diverse workforce through community partnerships.
- It is the most successful service model used to assist those recovering from mental illness in gaining employment.
